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Introduction

Life is daily. People normally have a daily physical routine that includes working, eating, and sleeping. Having a routine for our spiritual life is also important. We always have time for what we consider important. Here are some *Recommended Daily Allowances* for your spiritual health.

These are guidelines for disciples of Jesus Christ who desire to grow spiritually — which should not be allowed to become legalistic bondage. God's Word should make us free — not put us in bondage.

However, we cannot expect our flesh to rejoice about feeding our spiritual nature. To walk in the spirit and grow spiritually, as God intends, requires us to go against the flow of this world system. It *will* take effort.

God will *not* love you more because you follow these guidelines. They are recommended for your benefit — not required to make God love you. However, without following them your spiritual development will be slowed.

Jesus taught that God's Word is a seed (Luke 8:11). Plant the seed of God's Word in your life and you will reap blessings, if you don't give up (Galatians 6:9).

In Joshua 1:7-9, God gave instructions for success. They will still work for you today. It is not enough to read God's Word. You must also speak it, meditate on it, and act on it. By speaking it and hearing it, you plant it in your heart. Meditating on God's Word helps you to "digest" it — getting its full benefit.

The promise of Jesus in John 8:31-32 is for you. If you continue in the Word of God, you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free! Only those who continue in God's Word come to the place of knowing called faith. Faith is not trying to believe. Faith is knowing.

Faith comes by hearing the Word of God (Romans 10:17). *Nothing will build your faith as quickly as speaking God's Word*.

However, faith and spiritual growth should not be our main focus. They only enable us to walk with God and serve others in His Name. A growing love for God, and acts of loving service (ministry) to those near-by should be the fruit of our spiritual growth.

"Jesus said to him, 'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' " (Matthew 22:37-39)

Prayer Guidelines

Prayer is communication with God. Talking with Almighty God is the greatest privilege you have.

God desires a growing relationship with you. Communication is essential for a relationship to develop. Involve God in every part of your life: every decision and every action. In that sense you should pray without ceasing — always being in communication with God.

However, we need special prayer times focused completely on the Lord. He is worthy of our time and attention — and we require this time with Him to develop spiritually.

Remember the instruction given in Psalm 100:4, "Enter into His gates with thanksgiving, and into His courts with praise." If you seem to run out of words to praise God, use some of the Psalms, or praise and give thanks in tongues (1 Corinthians 14:16-18).

Many use the model prayer our Lord gave in Matthew 6:9-13 as a guideline for their special daily prayer time. Some of the principles taught are:

- You are praying to your Father.
- First worship and honor God.
- Pray that God's will be done before praying about your own or others' needs.
- Ask for God's forgiveness and help.
- Finish by praising God.

During times of prayer many find it helpful as a memory aid to have a prayer list of people and things to pray for. Also, keeping a journal of your prayer requests and answers is beneficial and will bless you tremendously as the years go by.

Always base your prayer on Scripture. Scripture is God's answer. Receiving from God in prayer involves taking His answer (His Word) to Him and receiving your request by faith.

Also, every believer should develop the habit of praying much in tongues. This not only edifies you spiritually (1 Corinthians 14:4, Jude 1:20), but allows you to pray with a wisdom beyond your ability and knowledge (Romans 8:26-27).

Pray Before Bible Reading

The Bible is alive. You will miss vast riches without the Lord opening your understanding and revealing His Word to you. Always ask God to teach you as you approach His Word.

1 CORINTHIANS 2:14 NKJ

14 But the natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.

(Living) I don't use bad language. I say only what is good and helpful to those I am talking to, and what will give them a blessing.

(New Life) I watch my talk! No bad words should be coming from my mouth. I say what is good. My words should help others grow as Christians.

(CEV) I stop all dirty talk. I say the right thing at the right time and help others by what I say.

Neighborhood Confession

My neighborhood includes______.

Jesus is Lord of my neighborhood! The devil's power is broken in my neighborhood!

In Jesus' Name I say the people of my neighborhood: are receiving Jesus Christ as Lord and turning away from sin; are hungry for God's Word and believe it; are prospering spiritually and materially; are supporting and actively participating in their local churches; are reverencing God and His Word.

Bible Study Guidelines

Study can include whatever you do that examines the Bible — reading, meditation, memorization, word studies, character studies, topical studies, book studies, etc.

Your daily devotional time should include time spent on: Prayer, Bible Confession, and Bible Study. God's Word will dwell in you if you dwell in it.

COLOSSIANS 3:16 NKJ 16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly...

Read (and/or Listen) Confess Meditate Memorize Study

Reading the Bible is the foundation of spiritual growth. (If you have no access to a Bible, God does not expect you to read it. He will reveal Himself to those who seek Him in another way. More is required from those to whom more is given, so if you have access to a Bible you must read it, or have it read to you.)

Confessing (speaking) God's Word is commanded for Christians. Why?

- Faith comes by hearing words.
- Words are seeds planted that produce results after their kind.
- God promises that we will prosper and succeed if we do so.
- Authority is exercised by words. Authority unused gives no advantage.

Meditation of God's Word involves focusing and thinking deeply on it. This should include speaking, thinking, and imagination. (Speaking it helps keep your thoughts from drifting.) Think about the Scripture passage. Mutter it to yourself. Turn it over in your mind. Think about how this will change things. Imagine things being that way in your life. Emphasize each different word in the passage in turn, as you speak it. Meditating Scripture benefits you tremendously.

Plan to memorize at least one new scripture each week. Write the scripture on a small card which you can easily carry in your pocket. Then you can use spare moments during the day to memorize and meditate it. Memorizing scripture stores it in your mind making it available for meditation at any time. Because speaking God's Word is our spiritual weapon (Ephesians 6:17), we need to have it available in memory for use at any time — just like Jesus did.

If you are fortunate enough to have access to an audio version of the Bible, listening to the Bible makes it easy to feed in large amounts of Scripture. *The more you expose yourself to the Bible, the more it will expose itself to you.*

Bible Reading Record

The Bible contains 1189 chapters: 929 in the Old Testament and 260 in the New. Reading 3 chapters each day and 5 chapters on Sundays will cover the entire Bible in one year. Follow some plan. Even one chapter each day will cover the New Testament in only 9 months. God's Word is alive. The more you expose yourself to it, the more it will expose itself to you.
